Ashamed of Messing Up Romans 1:13-17

What are you ashamed of?

Romans 1:1-12

- Paul--
- The Romans--
- Eager to come to Rome--
- Gospel-- $\varepsilon \mathring{v} \alpha \gamma \gamma \varepsilon \lambda \iota o \nu$ (euangelion)--

Romans 1:13-17 I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that I have often intended to come to you (but thus far have been prevented), in order that I may obtain some fruit among you as I have among the rest of the Gentiles. ¹⁴I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish ¹⁵—hence my eagerness to proclaim the gospel to you also who are in Rome. ¹⁶For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith."

Three Reasons Paul is Eager to Share the Gospel:					
I. The gospel					
Romans 1:13 I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that I have often intended to come to you (but thus far have been prevented), in order that I may obtain some fruit among you as I have among the rest of the Gentiles.					
II. The gospel					
Romans 1:14-15 I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish ¹⁵ —hence my eagerness to proclaim the gospel to you also who are in Rome.					

- How is Paul indebted to people he's never met?
- People hide their shame behind:
 - 1. Culture (Greek)--
 - 2. Rebellion (Barbarians)--
 - 3. Education (wise)--
 - Excuses (foolish)--
 - 5. Religion (Jew and Greek)--

III. The gospel _

Romans 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

- Why would Paul make it a point to say he's not ashamed of something he believes in?
- Why would anyone be ashamed of the gospel of Jesus Christ?
 - o "the Jew"--
 - o "the Greek"--

Why not be ashamed?

Romans 1:17 For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith."
