Acts 6:6-7:1 And Stephen, full of grace and power, was performing great wonders and signs among the people. 9 But some men from what was called the Synagogue of the Freedmen, including both Cyrenians and Alexandrians, and some from Cilicia and Asia, rose up and argued with Stephen. 10 But they were unable to cope with the wisdom and the Spirit with which he was speaking. 11 Then they secretly induced men to say, "We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and against God." 12 And they stirred up the people, the elders and the scribes, and they came up to him and dragged him away and brought him before the Council. 13 They put forward false witnesses who said, "This man incessantly speaks against this holy place and the Law; 14 for we have heard him say that this Nazarene, Jesus, will destroy this place and alter the customs which Moses handed down to us." 15 And fixing their gaze on him, all who were sitting in the Council saw his face like the face of an angel. 7:1 The high priest said, "Are these things so?"

Acts 7:2-6, And he (Stephen) said, "Hear me, brethren and fathers! The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham when he was in Mesopotamia, before he lived in Haran, and said to him, 'Leave your country and your relatives, and come into the land that I will show you (Gen 12:1)'... But He (God) gave him no inheritance in it, not even a foot of ground, and yet even when he had not child, He promised that He 'would give it to him as a possession, and to His descendants after him.' (Gen 12:7). But God spoke to this effect, that his 'descendants would be aliens in a foreign land, and that they would be enslaved and mistreated for four hundred years.'(Gen 15:13)"
